

By vote of the Board, as of February 15, 2011, the Homes Association will pay the cost to remove damaged or dead street trees (trees between the sidewalk and the street), including the stumps. Replacement of these trees is the decision of, and at the expense of, the resident.

Recommended Tree Species for Street Planting in Northfield Village

The Missouri Department of Conservation has compiled a great resource for Missouri Homeowners in regards to planting and caring for urban trees. They recommend the following trees for Street Planting.
